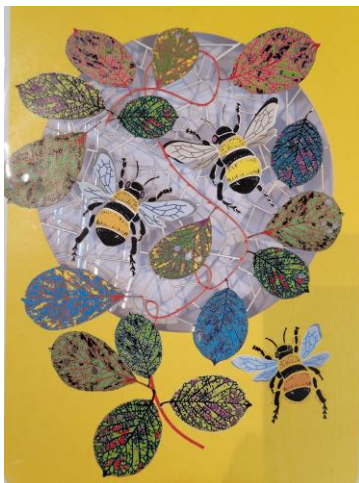

Welcome to the middle month of summer! I have just returned from my trip to England with my mother, where we had the good fortune to see many magnificent gardens, including Sissinghurst and Great Dixter. It was very inspiring! It's great to see that many of the plants that caught our attention are available in the Baystate Perennial newsletter which details plants for the early July border. Giant Scabiosa (*Cephalaria gigantea*) and Thalictrum varieties (especially *Thalictrum flavum* – yellow Meadow Rue) had really caught our eye. One of the things we particularly noticed is the use of wild meadow spaces. All the gardens have them- even a small house lot on the High Street in Tenterden had a little wedge of meadow. This got me interested in lawns and meadows, and in poking around I notice that a friend that I know from working in Turners Falls and the Ave A planters, Owen Wormser, has written a book on this very topic. Soil pH Testing at the GGC Garden Tour

Don't forget that the Western Mass Master Gardeners will be at the ticket sales area offering to test your soil's pH level. A donation of \$2 per test will be gratefully accepted. Soil analysis is a big help in maintaining the productivity and vigor of your gardens. I see the UMass testing lab turn-around time is currently normal right now (6-10 days), so it would be a good time to get your soil tested. The method of collecting the sample is crucial – check [here](#) for a detailed description of the best way to obtain your sample. A routine soil analysis is \$20. This will cover pH, acidity, Modified Morgan extractable nutrients (P, K, Mg, Fe, Mn, Zn, Cu, B), lead and aluminum, cation exchange capacity, and percent base saturation. Recommendations for nutrient and pH adjustment are included with your results. Optional tests are also available – Soil Organic Matter (\$6), Soluble Salts (\$6), and Soil Nitrate (\$8). Descriptions of these can be found at the link above regarding soil sampling. For ordering information and forms, please visit [this link](#). They currently accept cash, check or money orders, but not credit/debit cards or other electronic payments. All orders must be accompanied by a payment. They recommend that customers get in the habit of testing in late fall (annual crops, for planning spring amendments) or summer (turf, for planning early fall and early spring amendments) so that delays in processing can be avoided but results are still available when needed.

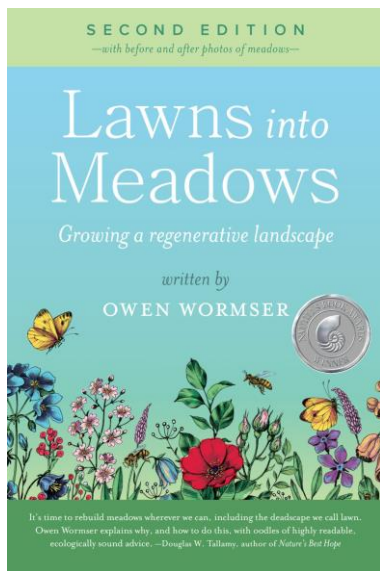

Coming this September 15th! The 2nd Edition of Landscape Designer Owen Wormser's book Lawns into Meadows. Wormser explains how to replace the deadscape we call lawn with low-maintenance, eco-friendly meadows. This award-winning, how-to book on growing your own wildflowers and native grasses is also about sustainability, regeneration, and beauty. In a world where lawns have wreaked havoc on our natural ecosystems, meadows offer a compelling solution. It is garden landscaping that is beautiful, all year round. Meadows establish wildlife and pollinator habitats, are low-maintenance and low-cost, have a built-in resilience that helps them weather climate extremes, and can draw down and store far more carbon dioxide than any manicured lawn. JULY RECIPE: MONARDA MOJITO

INGREDIENTS

- 15 Fresh bee balm leaves (*Monarda didyma*)
- 1/2 Lime, cut into 4 wedges
- 2-3 tbsp simple syrup (see recipe below)
- 1 cup ice cubes
- 1 1/2 fl oz. white rum
- 1/2 cup club soda

DIRECTIONS

1. Place bee balm and 1 lime wedge in tall sturdy glass and muddle well.
2. Add 2 more lime wedges and simple syrup and muddle further.
3. fill glass 3/4 with ice and pour rum over ice.
4. top with soda and stir. Adjust syrup as needed for sweetness.
5. Garnish with remaining lime wedge.

SIMPLE SYRUP

Makes 1/2 cup simple syrup

1. Combine 2 TB hot water with 4 tbsp sugar and stir until dissolved.
2. Add 2 tbsp cold water and stir.



KILL YOUR LAWN *with* DAN JAFFE WILDER

The lawn is this monoculture of non-native grasses, that's not diverse and doesn't really serve the ecology. Lawns are a whole lot of work, and they don't give us anything in return. And when I say us, I mean the entire ecosystem, humans being a very important part of it. But the lawns from an ecological point of view are at the very least a waste of space, and in some cases are truly a detriment to the ecological function. There are gradients of ecology, by which you rank various shifts, either in the way we care for our lawns or changes instead of lawns that we can make. Almost anyone could do the first gradient level. The gradients of ecology allow us to really look at this on a step-by-step process. You don't have to go full swing into it if you're not ready for it. And most people aren't. And you can start very, very small. Watch Dan's lecture for free on [YouTube](#).

New Native Nursery in Franklin County – [Checkerspot Farm](#)

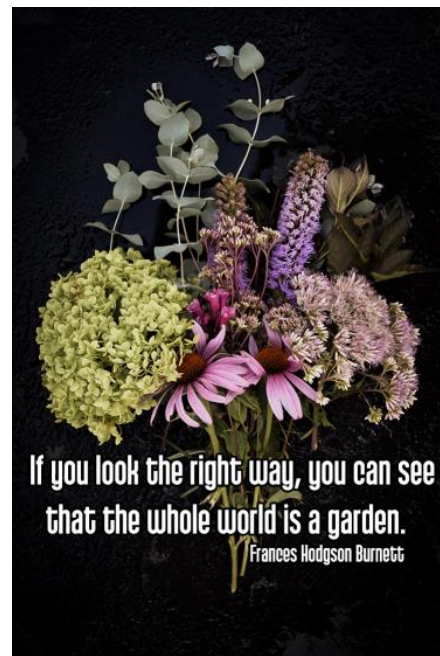

Planting and Stewarding Native Meadows: An Intensive One-Day Workshop with Larry Weaner

September 17th | 10am -4 pm | Berkshire Botanical

Demand for native meadows, particularly as an alternative to lawn, is increasing dramatically. That said, few planting types are more misunderstood. Many failures result from inadequate planning and management; as well as the use of plants that are poorly adapted to the site and unable to survive in a highly competitive meadow environment. Far better results can be obtained when the plants and processes used reflect the ecological character of our native meadow communities. More than one-year wonders, meadows modeled on these ecosystems can provide long-term, easily managed landscapes that harbor a myriad of wildlife and provide color and texture throughout the year. The program will begin with Landscape Designer Larry Weaner discussing the design, implementation, and management of native meadows on a variety of scales and in residential and public settings. The remainder of the day will include viewing on-property meadows including a meadow-in-progress and an area with high potential for a future meadow planting.

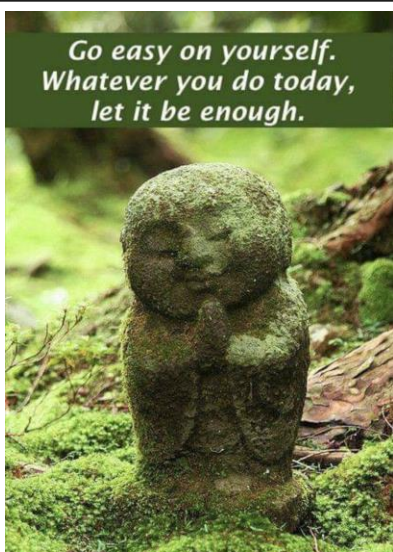


Thalictrum flavum – Yellow Meadow Rue
