Master the Art of the Photo Book

What do you do with all of those garden pictures? Are they stored on your computer or phone never to be seen again? If they are, then the October Garden Club meeting is for you! Deb Loomer will be presenting a hands-on workshop at her house on **Wednesday, October 18th** for those folks who want to learn how to make a photo book, like those that are offered on Groupon for a reduced price. She will go over a step by step process using the Shutterfly online site to show you how you can make a book, but then personalize that book of your garden (or other) photos. Then you can pick the book up from your coffee table in the middle of January and dream big about next year's garden. If you have not already done so, take some pictures in your garden of your flowers or your landscape. What worked right in the

garden and what you might want to change for next year. Take a picture of that container garden which finally had the perfect combination of flowers in it.

You will need to bring your laptop or iPad with the pictures already loaded on it. Deb is a laptop person, but she is fairly sure she can help people who have iPads. Please – no cell phones - as Deb does not know how to use them to create photo books. We will sign on to the internet and go from there. She will also let you know about other sites you can use and what their advantages and disadvantages are. If you have other pictures that are not garden related feel free to come and work on that project. Hopefully by the time you leave you will be on your way to a finished project. She has done over 50 books using multiple web sites and will tell you the process is easy once you get the hang of it.

The meeting will start at **6:00 pm and will last 1 1/2 hours**. You can, however, stay as late as you like if you would like to complete your project in one sitting.

Directions: the address is 21 Highland Rd., Gill, MA. A GPS will get you to her house. It is across the road from Barton's Cove Campground. You cannot see her house from Route 2 as it is up in the woods, but that is the approximate location. If you know you will be staying later, come up the driveway and park up at the top. If you might need to leave sooner, then park at the bottom either in the parking area or along the side of the road. There is no traffic on the road.

Linda's Famous Bok Choy Salad

A winner at the steering cttee potlucks!

Greens:

1 large bunch of Bok Choy

1 bunch scallions

* Chop and store the greens in a container with a paper towel to absorb the moisture.

Crunchies:

2 TBSP sugar

¼ c butter

1 package ramen noodles (no seasoning)

½ c sesame seeds

½ c slivered almonds

* In a frying pan, combine sugar, butter, crushed Ramen noodles, sesame seeds, and slivered almonds. Cook over medium heat until browned, about 15 – 20 minutes.

Allow to cool and store in a container.

Dressing:

2 TBSP soy sauce

¼ c sugar

½ c balsamic vinegar

¾ c oil

* Combine dressing ingredients. Store in a container.

When ready to serve, toss greens with crunchies and then add the dressing. Eat it up as it does not store well after mixing all three groups of ingredients.

The easiest way to clean Bok Choy is to treat it like a bunch of celery. Trim off and discard the end of the bulb and separate the stalks. Wash the stalks in cool water, carefully brushing away any sand or dirt that remains. Wrap in paper towels and store for up to a week in your refrigerator's crisper drawer or use immediately. Slice the stalks in the same manner as you would slice celery, using the entire stalk including the leaves at the top.

with steps that are ever the same.

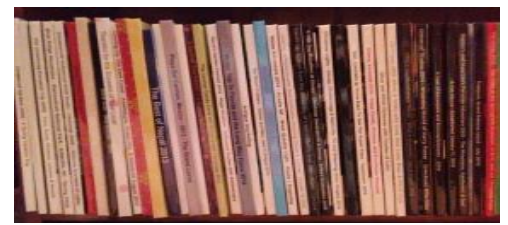
Though we do not know our exact location,
