June Meeting: June 18, 2013 – THIS IS A TUESDAY! (In the event of a teeming downpour, the rain date will be Wednesday the 19th.) Carpool will leave Cherry Rum Plaza at 5:15pm.

We will be traveling to see the gardens and greenhouse of artist and succulent aficionado Abigail Rorer. Abigail & her husband, Charles Buell, live on a farm in Petersham, MA and have a number of flower gardens including a large rock garden, an extensive vegetable garden, and a greenhouse full of succulent plants. Abigail is the succulent enthusiast, has been growing them for at least 25 years, and built the greenhouse in 1987 to house her collection. She is also a certified Cactus & Succulent judge. During the visit to her gardens there will be an informal talk about succulents and some plants for sale.

Directions to: 16 Oliver Street, Petersham, MA 01366 Abigail's phone- 978-724-6672 Take Route 2 east to exit 15. At the end of the ramp, take a right. Go a short distance to a stop sign. This is the intersection with Route 202. Take a right onto route 202 west toward Amherst. Not very far down the road is the intersection of Route 202 and Route 122 toward Petersham & Worcester. Take the left onto Route 122 south. When you get near the center of Petersham you will see The Garage. There is only one garage, no gas, and it is called "The Garage". Take the left just before it-Route 32 north. Then take your first right: Oliver Street. Go down the road passing fields on either side and a pond on the right, and her house is the little brown house on the right with the attached greenhouse. Go past the house, turn right in front of the stone barn and park in that area.

Garden Club Steering Committee Minutes - 5/28/13

MARKETING EFFORTS:

Donna reported on the work being done to improve the Garden Club's marketing efforts.

Kaitlin, who is working on the website for House on the Hill, is helping to redesign the Garden Club's logo.

Donna will have something for us to look at in the near future. A new logo will lead us to think about tee shirts, bags, etc. for next year's Extravaganza and Garden Tour.

Donna also brought a couple of cute ideas to use for events & around Trap Plain and encouraged us all to be on the look-out for similar items. Turning to the work being done by the GBA, Donna reported that the barrels have been planted.

Members were pleased last year by the absence of vandalism and the placement of the barrels. There are 30 planted this year. With success, more will be planted next year. It has been recommended by the Conway School of Design that the existing grates around the trees are not healthy. Efforts are underway to determine how/who to remove them. Donna is doing a lot of this work personally. Jean Wall

motioned that the Garden Club vote to be a sponsor for the Beautification Committee's efforts. Jeanne seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

EXTRAVAGANZA RECAP:

The proceeds were \$778.45. Not bad given the weather! Suggestions for next year included: better advertising, better signage, a sandwich board at the Farmer's market, shut down earlier, sell some of the extra 'stuff': mugs, bags, etc., work with Holly Spatcher for annuals, and explore having vendors.

On June 29 there will be a Garden Club tour of John Trexler's garden in Boylston.

The committee is very enthusiastic - the gardens all look amazing! Ten gardens have been identified and nine have been confirmed. Norm will follow up with Diane Tidlund, the 10th garden. The need for co-hosts and weeders has been identified. The next step is to assign them to gardens and notify them. Jeanne, Norm and Elise will do that. Norm will prepare the map with the garden descriptions. The map will be the ticket for the tour. The price is \$12/person. Marsha Stone has volunteered to chair the refreshments. Linda has the signs. Norm will get them from her and 'refurbish' them. The committee will place them out on Friday night. Good publicity will be the key to the success of this event! Laura, Dolly, Norm, Jeanne and Linda all have responsibilities here.

Here is a list of helpful tips taken from the UMass Garden Calendar for the month of June.

The Vegetable Garden

*Plant eggplant, peppers, cucumbers, squash and melon transplants the first week in June

*Plant seeds of cucumbers, melons and squash

*Mulch around vegetable plants now that soil has warmed

*Harvest outside leaves of parsley and let inner leaves grow

*Shade lettuce plant during hot weather using shade cloth or lattice

*Thin vegetable crops and let remaining plants develop
